- Presentations with various activities according to age group

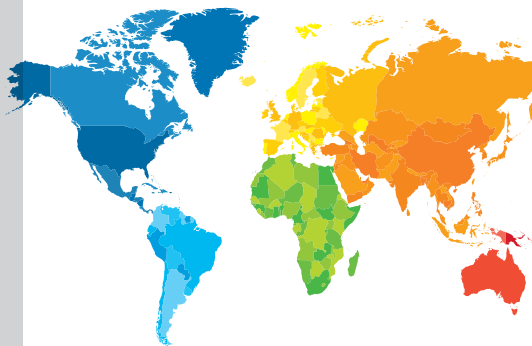
